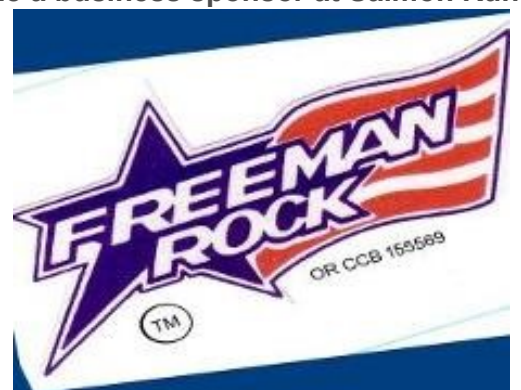
July is starting out busy so please remember to make tee times and fix your ball marks!

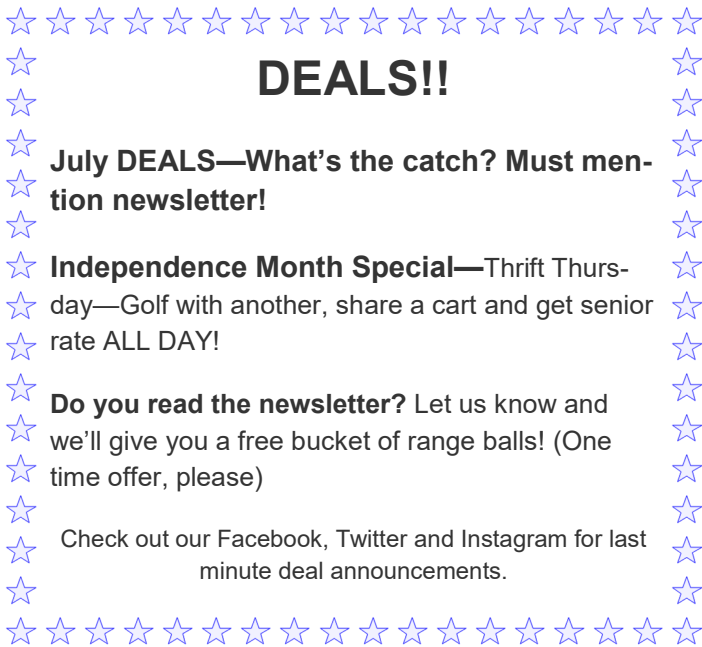
